Make sure your story has clues to show what time period it is set in (the type of house, objects they use etc).



The Stone Age Rocks!

Make a photo montage of prehistoric monuments. You can create a PowerPoint presentation or Word document.



Find out more about rock art - human-made markings placed on natural stone. Draw an animal or a pet in the style of a prehistoric cave painting. Use only colours made from natural objects such as berries or mud.



Find out which animals lived during the Stone Age. Choose an extinct animal from this era and find out as much information as you can. Present your information as a written report or poster.



Find out about one of the world's most mysterious prehistoric monuments and create a poster, fact sheet or leaflet to share what you have found out. Here are some ideas:

Make a 3-D model of a Prehistoric settlement or Stonehenge



The Neolithic Revolution, also called the Agricultural Revolution, marked the transition in human history from small, nomadic bands of hunter-gatherers to larger, agricultural settlements and early civilization. Find out the types of food available at the end of the Stone Age and create a Neolithic Stone Age Menu.

You could even create your own Stone Age restaurant at home and create a Stone Age three course meal for your family!
